

Worksheet 2 of 8: How has God communicated with His creation? (KEY)

Please compare this answer key to your answers from the worksheet. You are encouraged to note any incorrect answers and ask any questions you may have regarding anything that is not understood.

1. God commanded Adam not to eat **b**. (**Genesis 2:16-17**)
2. After sinning against God's commandment, Adam and Eve **b**. (**Genesis 3:8-9**)
3. The Lord walked with Adam and Eve in the garden, **d**. (**Genesis 3:8-9**)
4. God communicated with Noah and Abram (later to big called Abraham) by **c**. (**Genesis 9:8-9; Genesis 17:1-2**)
5. Moses **a**. (**Deuteronomy 5:5,22**)
6. Jeremiah was not ordained by God as a prophet before nations. **F** (**Jeremiah 1:5**)
7. The children of Israel were to offer bull sacrifices for their unintentional sins. **T** (**Leviticus 4:1-3**)
8. God told the children of Israel that if there were a prophet among them that He would speak to him in a dream. **T** (**Numbers 12:6**)
9. Moses declared to the people that which God had told him and commanded of them all. **T** (**Deuteronomy 1:3**)
10. The book of Jeremiah is not really the word of God. **F** (**Jeremiah 17:5**)
11. The children of Israel could still be obedient to God if they decided to disobey what Moses spoke to them. **F** (**Leviticus 8:4-5**)
12. The Holy Spirit moved and guided the writers of the New Testament into all truth. **T** (**John 16:13-14**)
13. The Holy Spirit was going to declare the words of Christ, but the Spirit would speak on His own authority. **F** (**John 16:13-14**)
14. Today, God has communicated to us through the words of His Son, Jesus Christ. These words make up the New Testament. **T** (**Hebrews 1:1-2; John 16:13-14; 2 Peter 1:20-21**)
15. We are still commanded to tithe and are required to pay our dues to the church. **F** (**Hebrews 8:13; Romans 10:4; 1 Corinthians 16:2; 2 Corinthians 9:7**)
16. The blood of bulls and goats could not take away **sins**. (**Hebrews 10:4**)
17. Forgiveness of sins is possible through the blood of **Christ**. (**Colossians 1:14**)
18. Christ is the end of the **law**. (**Romans 10:4**)
19. If the Old Testament were still binding today, then Christ would have died in **vain**. (**Galatians 2:21**)
20. Christ is the **author** of eternal salvation to all who **obey** Him. (**Hebrews 5:9**)
21. Today, commands that require the abstaining from meats or other foods are commandments and doctrines of **men**. (**Colossians 2:20-23**)
22. God told Jeremiah that He would make a **new covenant**. Today, the old covenant is **obsolete**. (**Jeremiah 31:31; Hebrews 8:13**)
23. The Old Law was a **tutor** until faith had come through **Christ**. Now that faith has come we are no longer under a **tutor**. Therefore, we are no longer to keep feasts, new moons, or the **sabbath**. (**Galatians 3:23-25; Colossians 2:16-17**)
24. Although we are no longer under the old law, we are to still **learn** from the examples of those things that were written before. (**Romans 15:4**)
25. Anyone who preaches a gospel other than the gospel of Christ will be **accursed**. Some will try to **pervert** the gospel of Christ, but what they preach is a different gospel and it is not from God. (**Galatians 1:6-8**)
