

Worksheet 3 of 8: How can we be saved from our sins? (KEY)

1. Your sins d. (John 14:6; Hebrews 5:8-9)
2. The gospel of Christ is c and spending eternity in heaven with God the Father c. (Romans 1:16; John 14:6; Hebrews 5:8-9)
3. Jesus Christ d. (Hebrews 5:8-9; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4; 1 John 5:20)
4. The first gospel sermon as recorded in Acts chapter 2 a. (Acts 2:14-17; Acts 2:22-23; Acts 2:32-33, 36; Acts 2:37)
5. When those who heard Peter's sermon understood the gospel and asked what they should do, Peter responded d. (Acts 2:38)
6. Christ is perfect and is the author of eternal salvation to all who just believe. (Hebrews 5:9) F
7. Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by speakers of motivational wisdom. (Romans 10:17) F
8. If someone does not believe and have faith, they can still be saved by being immersed in water. (Hebrews 11:6; Mark 16:15-16) F
9. The word of God is written so you may believe that Jesus is the Son of God, and in believing you may have life in His name. (Romans 10:17; John 20:31) T
10. Those who were convicted and baptized following Peter's sermon were saved and the Lord then added them to the church. (Acts 2:40-41; Acts 2:47) T
11. Even the demons believe and tremble; by this we can understand that faith without works is clearly dead. (James 2:19-20, 24) T
12. Believing in God is like believing in a never failing, perfect parachute; if you really believe the parachute will open and save you, you will jump out of the plane. Just as true faith in God is followed by works of obedience to His Son, believing that obedience to Christ's commands leads to salvation. (Hebrews 5:9; James 2:19-20; 24) T
13. Prior to repentance one cannot be saved, for they have yet to change their mind deciding that they wanted to do God's will; therefore, one must repent before becoming saved. (Acts 2:38; Luke 13:3; Acts 17:30; Acts 9:4; Acts 9:6) T
14. Having to confess Jesus Christ is the Son of God is overrated and silly. (Matthew 10:32) F
15. If one does not believe, then they will not obey; therefore, he who believes and is baptized will be saved. (Mark 16:15-16) T
16. We are told that calling on the name of the Lord involves one washing away their sins through baptism. (Acts 22:16)
17. One who is baptized has their sins washed away. (Acts 22:16)
18. Baptism now saves us. (1 Peter 3:21)
19. Those who have put on Christ have been baptized into Christ. (Galatians 3:27)
20. One must repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ to receive remission of their sins. (Acts 2:38; Acts 22:16)
21. The eunuch heard the word of God when Phillip opened his mouth and preached Jesus to him. (Acts 8:30-31, 35)
22. As the eunuch repented and desired to do the will of God, Phillip told him that he could be baptized if he truly did believe. The eunuch then confessed by answering to Phillip saying, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God". (Acts 8:35-38)
23. Phillip and the eunuch went down into the water and Phillip baptized him. (Acts 8:35-38)
24. Those who do not obey the gospel of Christ will be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord. (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9)
25. One will remain reconciled if they continue in the faith, grounded, steadfast, and not moved away from the hope that salvation comes through obedience to the gospel. (Colossians 1:21-23)
