

# Worksheet 5 of 8: What is acceptable worship in the church Christ built? (KEY)

Please compare this answer key to your answers from the worksheet. You are encouraged to note any incorrect answers and ask any questions you may have regarding anything that is not understood.

- Based on the foundation of truth that Jesus is the Son of the living God as declared by Peter, Christ said He would build c. **(Matthew 16:16-18)**
- A “church” that is not built on the foundation of Christ’s commands c. **(Matthew 7:24-27)**
- Everyone whose faith has not been planted by God and His commands will a. **(Matthew 15:13-14)**
- The blind will lead the blind and b. **(Matthew 15:13-14)**
- Christ will declare c. **(Matthew 7:21-23)**
- The scriptures and examples written in the Old Testament are to be used for our learning. **(Romans 15:4) T**
- Noah used some redwood to build the ark because although God said to use gopherwood, He never said not to use redwood. **(Genesis 6:13-22) F**
- Noah didn’t think it made sense to build the ark based on the dimensions commanded by God, after all Noah certainly did not see a need for that big of an ark, so he built one that was smaller. **(Genesis 6:13-22) F**
- Since Noah revered God and obeyed His commands; he was saved from the flood. **(Genesis 7:23; 1 Peter 3:30-21) T**
- Baptism saves us today, just as the ark was used to save Noah from the flood. **(1 Peter 3:20-21) T**
- Since God didn’t use the words “you have to” when saying that the blood should be put on the lintel and the two doorposts, it meant that anything was really ok as long as there was blood somewhere they would be saved. **(Exodus 12:21-23, 29) F**
- If one worships God based on the commands and doctrines of men, it is still acceptable worship because they are at least trying. **(Mark 7:6-8; Colossians 2:20-23) F**
- God has authorized the use of musical instruments, juggling, and entertaining the assembly during worship. **(Hebrews 2:12; Ephesians 5:19; Hebrews 13:15; Colossians 3:16; 1 Corinthians 14:40; Hebrews 12:28; Revelation 22:18-19) F**
- If one does not abide in the doctrine of Christ, then they do not have God. **(2 John 9) T**
- When we worship God the Father, we are worshiping the almighty authority; therefore, we must do so in the way in which He, God, has commanded us to worship Him by doing it in accordance with His truth. **(John 4:23-24) T**
- By following the example of the first century Christians, we can know that we are to worship God on the first day of every week. **(Acts 20:7)**
- We are to obey the elders within the church and be submissive because they watch out for our souls. **(Hebrews 13:17)**
- We must attend both worship services and Bible studies because we are told not to forsake the assembling of the church. **(Hebrews 10:24-25)**
- Those that preach during worship must declare the whole council of God. Meaning, preachers can’t avoid certain commands that may be difficult for some to hear due to the change that they would have to make in their lives to be acceptable in the sight of God. For example a preacher can’t avoid teaching the truth that divorce (Matthew 5:32) cannot take place except for fornication. **(Acts 20:27)**
- Those in the first century church continued in the apostles’ doctrine, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers. **(Acts 2:42)**
- We are to give on the first day of the week as we purpose in our heart and not of necessity. **(1 Corinthians 16:1-2; 2 Corinthians 9:7)**
- In the first century church we read that on the first day of the week the disciples came together to break bread and when we eat the bread and drink the cup we proclaim the Lord’s death until He comes. **(Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 11:23-28)**
- When we sing we are to make melody in our hearts. **(Ephesians 5:19)**
- Worshiping God should be done decently and in order with reverence and Godly fear. **(1 Corinthians 14:40; Hebrews 12:28)**
- Nadab and Abihu were devoured by the Lord’s fire because they offered profane fire before the Lord which He had not commanded them. **(Leviticus 10:1-2)**
