

Worksheet 6 of 8: Is continued obedience to Christ essential for salvation? (KEY)

1. Christ is the author of eternal salvation to all who obey d. (**Hebrews 5:9**)
2. Becoming saved requires obedience to Christ by d. (**Hebrews 11:6; Acts 2:38; Acts 8:36-38;**)
3. Baptism is d. (**1 Corinthians 1:12-13; Acts 19:3-5; Acts 2:38; Acts 8:36-38; Galatians 3:17; 1 Peter 3:21**)
4. If someone is baptized for any other reasons other than to be saved in Christ Jesus, then c. (**Acts 19:3-5, 1 Peter 3:21, Galatians 3:27**)
5. Salvation will come a. (**1 Peter 1:9; Mark 12:30; John 14:15; Revelation 2:10**)
6. Salvation is something we can work for and earn and is something that we can do ourselves. (**Ephesians 2:8**) F
7. Everyone has already been given access to God's grace no matter what they do. (**Romans 5:1-2; James 2:19-20, 24**) F
8. We have access into God's grace through a faith that consists of obedient works. (**Romans 5:1-2; James 2:19-20, 24**) T
9. After being saved through faithful obedience by God's grace, one can never fall from the grace of God. (**Galatians 5:4**) F
10. Once someone is saved, they are always saved and their salvation is guaranteed. (**Hebrews 5:9; Galatians 5:4**) F
11. Joshua was unable to carry out God's commands because they were ambiguous and unclear. (**Joshua 6:2-5; Joshua 6:12-16**) F
12. Joshua thought it was ridiculous to march around the city in order to win the battle of Jericho; therefore, he chose not to obey God and ended up winning the battle using his own ideas. (**Joshua 6:2-5; Joshua 6:12-16; Joshua 6:2-21**) F
13. When God told Moses to speak to the rock, what He really meant was that Moses could do whatever he thought would be best. (**Numbers 20:7-12; Deuteronomy 3:23-26**) F
14. God would not allow Moses to enter the promise land because he disobeyed Him and struck the rock instead of speaking to it. (**Numbers 20:7-12; Deuteronomy 3:23-26**) T
15. Since Uzza had the best of intentions in catching the ark when it had fallen, God ignored his disobedience. (**Numbers 4:15; 1 Chronicles 13:9-10**) F
16. So then each of us shall give an account of himself to God. (**Romans 14:12**)
17. Not all religious people who say Lord, Lord shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of the Father. (**Matthew 7:21-23**)
18. On the Day of Judgment, many will say to Christ that they have done many wonders in His name; however, he will declare to them that He never knew them; and to depart from Him because they practice lawlessness. (**Matthew 7:21-23**)
19. We are to preach the gospel and those who believe and are baptized will be saved. (**Mark 16:15-16**)
20. True worshipers worship the Father in spirit and truth. Those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth. (**John 4:23-24**)
21. The church is to consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of the body. (**Hebrews 10:24-25**)
22. We love the children of God by loving God and keeping His commandments. For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments. (**1 John 5:2-4**)
23. Putting off the old man includes putting away anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. For we have spent enough time being the old man, when we walked in lewdness, lusts, drunkenness, revelries, drinking parties and abominable idolatries. (**Colossians 3:8-9; 1 Peter 4:3-5**)
24. One who has died with Christ through baptism and now lives for Him puts on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering, bearing one another, and forgiving one another. (**Colossians 3:12-14**)
25. Once we are saved, the blood of Christ cleanses us from all sin as we walk in the light by living our lives in accordance with His word. (**1 John 1:7**)
