Multiple Choice: For the following 5 questions, please write the letter that is most correct on the line.

- Your sins _____. (Romans 3:23; 1 John 3:4; Romans 6:23; Revelation 21:8)
 - are non-existent because you are sinless and have never done anything against the will of God
 - are “minor sins” such as lying and are “small” compared to “big sins” such as murdering, adultery, fornication, and drunkenness; therefore, you will not suffer eternally for the “small sins”
 - are indeed evident; however, there is nothing to worry about because God is not going to punish anyone in hell
 - are a fact because you have violated the law of God (by lying for example) and the consequence of your sins is eternal separation from God in hellfire

 - outdated because we now live in a modern society that has outgrown the old teachings of Christ’s time (AND) is available through any one of the various religious gods such as Buddha, Yahweh, Vishnu, Christ, or Allah
- Jesus Christ _____. (Hebrews 5:8-9; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4; 1 John 5:20)
 - was nothing more than a prophet
 - was a great man just like you and me
 - is the author of Christianity and one option on how one can go to heaven; other options include: Judaism, New Age, Buddhism, Islam, Gnosticism, Taoism, or really any belief (even though they all have different origins, commands, and god’s)
 - lived a perfect life, died, and rose from the dead; He is the Son of the true God and is the only source for eternal life
- The first gospel sermon as recorded in Acts chapter 2 _____. (Acts 2:14-17; Acts 2:22-23; Acts 2:32-33, 36; Acts 2:37)
 - was preached by Peter through inspiration of the Holy Spirit which Christ had received from the Father and poured out onto the apostles
 - was preached by Peter based on what he thought needed to be said
 - was not preached in the beginning of the last days because the last days have yet to come
 - convicted no one to ponder about what they should do to be justified in the sight of God
- When those who heard Peter’s sermon understood the gospel and asked what they should do, Peter responded _____. (Acts 2:38)
 - and said they needed to say a prayer
 - saying all they needed to do was believe and accept Jesus into their heart
 - telling them to be saved now through repentance and that they could be baptized later if they thought they needed to
 - saying repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins
